Be a responsible diver and snorkeller

Check the conditions. Be aware of water temperatures, currents, and weather forecasts before you leave.

Take a friend. Never dive or snorkel alone and always tell people where you are going. **Know who to contact.** Find out where the nearest medical facility is and note down who to contact in an emergency.

Know your surroundings. Check what the weater is doing and identify a landmark for reference.

- **Use the right equipment.** Only use good quality and well-fitting equipment .
- Wear the right protection. Wear a wetsuit
- if you tend to get cold and always remember to wear coral-safe sunscreen!

Follow the snorkellers Code.

Do not remove plants or animals from the rocks or from their homes.


- Take care not to kick sealife with fins or
- stand on coral or other delicate sealife.
- Observe animals where they live and don't take anything away with you.
- Do not anchor your boat always use the mooring buoys. Be aware of boats on the water.




